Evicted: Poverty and Profit in the American City, Matthew Desmond, published 2016, 418 pages

Evicted is a book about the state of Milwaukee's lower-end rental market that exposes many of the problems of poverty and race in inner-city America. Desmond is a sociology professor at Harvard and spent years living in a trailer park and other low-end apartments in Milwaukee to expose himself to the realities of the crises and add perspective to the narratives he weaves together. Evicted is a fantastic book that combines big picture data and statistics with many narratives of many families and individuals stuck in Milwaukee and American low-end housing crises.
