


Plain Reads – Join the Friends of the Kraemer Library as we celebrate the 20th anniversary of our library

Brief Review: *A Little Hope (a novel)* / Ethan Joella / 275 pages. The publisher's summary of the novel is as follows. [From book jacket]: "A luminous, life-affirming novel set in an idyllic Connecticut town over the course of a year, *A Little Hope* follows the intertwining lives of a dozen

neighbors as they confront everyday desires and fears: a lost love, a stalled career, an illness and a betrayal. Freddie and Greg Tyler seem to have it all: a comfortable home at the edge of the woods, a beautiful young daughter, a bond that feels unbreakable. But when Greg is diagnosed with a rare and aggressive form of cancer, the sense of certainty they once knew evaporates. Greg's boss, Alex Lionel, grapples with a secret of his own. Meanwhile, Darcy Crowley is still coming to terms with the loss of her husband as she worries about her struggling adult son, Luke. Ginger Lord returns home longing for a past relationship and Ahmed Ghannam wonders if he'll ever find true love.


