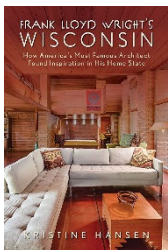

Arcadia Books, Spring Green

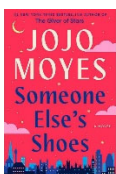


Saturday, June 17, 2-4 pm – Kristine Hansen will discuss her book, *Frank Lloyd Wright's Wisconsin*.

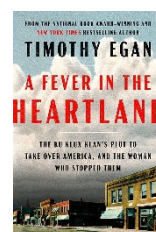

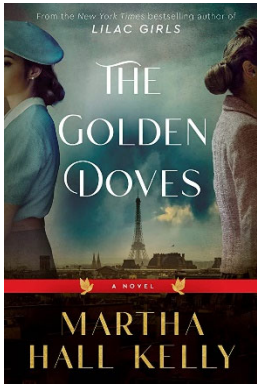

Book Recommendation



The Golden Doves, by Martha Hall Kelly (511 pages). This latest historical novel is just as good as the author's prior books. Be sure to at least skim the Author's Note at the end of the story for good background information. Here is the publisher's summary from the book jacket:

American Josie Anderson and Parisian Arlette LaRue are thrilled to be working in the French resistance, stealing so many Nazi secrets that they become known as the Golden Doves, renowned across France and hunted by the Gestapo. Their courage will cost them everything. When they are finally arrested and taken to the Ravensbruck concentration camp, along with their loved ones, a reclusive Nazi doctor does unspeakable things to Josie's mother, a celebrated Jewish singer who joined her daughter in Paris when the world seemed bright. And Arlette's son is stolen from her, never to be seen again.

A decade later the Doves fall headlong into a dangerous dual mission. Josie is working for the U.S. Army Intelligence and accepts an assignment to hunt down the infamous doctor, while a mysterious man tells Arlette that he may have found her son. The Golden Doves embark on a quest across Europe and ultimately to French Guiana, discovering a web of terrible secrets, and must put themselves in grave danger to finally secure justice and protect the ones they love.
