## Chicago: A Novel, by Brian Doyle / published 2016 / 309 pages



This is a book filled with mystery and awe, and a deep regard for community – the kind that can develop anywhere, in any circumstances, when people pay attention to and come to care about all that surrounds them.

Who is my neighbor? Brian Doyle finds neighbor in everything, from the people and animals in his apartment building and the busses on the street, to the skyscrapers of the city. Everything
