Lying in Wait, by Liz Nugent (publ 2018, 312 pages) – Psychopathic mother who murdered her twin as a young girl. Very controlling, mentally deranged individual. Lots of twists and turns. The son tries to escape from her control and make a life for himself. Not a happy ending, to say the least. Keeps your attention: a page turner for sure.


The Gunners, by Rebecca Kauffman (publ 2018, 261 pages) – This story is about six childhood friends who form a tight-knit group known as the "Gunners." They all grow up, move on with their lives, but still stay connected. One of the six commits suicide and they return together to mourn her loss and to support each other. This was a very good story about friendship, truth, and forgiveness.





Then She Was Gone, by Lisa Jewell (publ 2018, 359 pages) – The 15-year-old daughter disappears, leaving a family in tatters. Told from several points of view. The story is about loss, love, and recovery from the unthinkable. Rather unbelievable at times, but story keeps your attention. Fairly satisfying ending for most characters. Lots of twists and turns, but easy to read. Good development of characters.

You Were Made For This, by Michelle Sacks (publ 2018, 341 pages) – Fast-moving easy read of all dysfunctional, mostly immoral characters. Hard to decide who to dislike the most. No one seems to have any redeeming features. Interesting plot with lots of twists and turns. Ending not as expected, but should not come as a surprise, either.
