The Alice Network: A Novel / author Kate Quinn / 503 pages / published 2017 This novel tells the story of two women who come together to help each other move beyond wartime fears and traumas. Charlotte (Charlie) St Clair is 19 years old in 1947 and a math major at Bennington College. Her studies are interrupted when she discovers that she is pregnant. While her mother arranges a private abortion in Switzerland, Charlie eludes her mother during a layover. Charlie is troubled by the sudden disappearance of her cousin Rose, who disappeared somewhere in France during the recent war, and also by her only brother's suicide due she believes to his war experience.



When Charlie arrives at the home of Eve Gardiner, the last person who had contact with Rose, she receives an abrupt and rude welcome. In spite of this, Charlie is intrigued by Eve, especially her hands, which are so crippled that she needs the daily assistance of Finn Kilgore, a WW II veteran, who serves as driver and assistant. At this point, Charlie is unaware that Eve is a retired spy, a member of the famed Alice Network, a group of men and women who infiltrated German lines in France during the

First World War. Eve agrees to help Charlie find Rose and Charlie pawns her grandmother's pearls to finance the trip through France in Finn's sports car.

This exciting story unfolds in chapters alternately narrated by Eve which explain her experiences in the Alice Network and the score she wants to settle from her days as a spy. Charlie narrates the chapters that explain her close relationship to Rose and her brother, the trio's travels through France, and a burgeoning romance. As the two women work together to achieve their different goals, they develop a mutual respect.

Three novels similar to The Alice Network would be Trapeze by Simon Mawer, Rose, by Martin Cruz Smith, and Restless by William Boyd.
