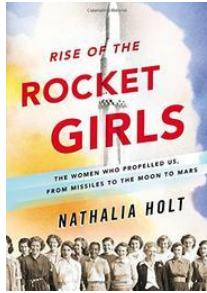

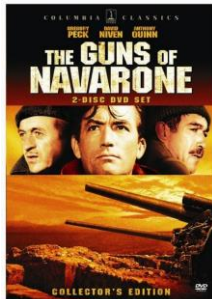
LIBRARY NEWS

Don’t Forget: New subscriptions this year: Smithsonian, Discover, and Sports Illustrated

“Zero Tolerance” in the January Consumer Reports focuses on how best to avoid hospital infections. The article also includes 15 tips for preventing infections and staying safe in the hospital and rankings of the highest and lowest scoring teaching hospitals at preventing central-line infections between 2011 and 2015.

The January Prevention magazine includes 30 stay-well strategies from people who never get sick. People who seldom get sick don’t have stronger immune systems: they develop their own strategies for staying healthy.

BOOK REVIEW – *The Cherry Harvest* | Lucy Sanna | 2015 | 323 pages

The setting of this debut novel by Lucy Sanna is Summer 1944, Door County, Wisconsin. Thomas and Charlotte Christensen run a large cherry orchard on County Road Q. Their son Benjamin is serving in the Army in Italy and daughter Kate is a high school senior. Due to the lack of available workers, they were unable to harvest their cherries in 1943 and money is tight. To provide enough food for the family, practical Charlotte is forced to supplement her vegetable garden by bartering. As the 1944 harvest approaches, the Christensens meet with local authorities and neighbors to request permission to use German POWs from a nearby camp as pickers for the harvest, and receive reluctant approval. The consequences of this request, which constitutes the bulk of the novel, brings tragedy and permanent changes to the family. The many plot twists make this a dramatic and suspenseful story about the results of poor choices, lies, and secrets.

Readers familiar with Door County may recognize certain landmarks mentioned in the novel, and those familiar with Wisconsin history may know that several German POW camps were established in the state during World War II. Novels similar to *The Cherry Harvest – In the*

Unlikely Event, Judy Blume / *At the Water's Edge*, Sara Gruen / *Day After Night*, Anita Diamant /
and *The Memory of Us*, Camille DiMaio.
