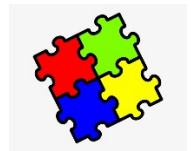

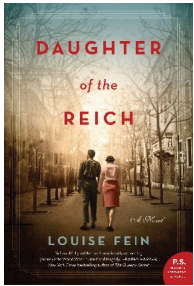

Book News



Brief Review: Daughter of the Reich / Louise Fein / 533 pages. This debut novel inspired by the life of the author's father is different from other World War II novels in that it is set in East Germany and the focus is the daughter of a high-ranking Nazi. Be sure to read the Author's Note at the end of the book for background information. Here is the publisher's summary of the novel:

As the dutiful daughter of a high-ranking Nazi officer, Hetty Heinrich is keen to play her part in the glorious new Thousand Year Reich. But she never imagines that all she believes and knows about her world will come into stark conflict when she encounters Walter Keller, a Jewish friend from the past who stirs dangerous feelings in her. Confused and conflicted, Hetty doesn't know whom she can trust and where she can turn to, especially when she discovers that someone has been watching her.

Realizing that she is taking a huge risk – but unable to resist the intense attraction she has for Walter – she embarks on a secret love affair with him. Together, they dream about when the war will be over and plan for their future. But as the rising tide of anti-Semitism threatens to engulf them, Hetty and Walter will be forced to take extreme measures.

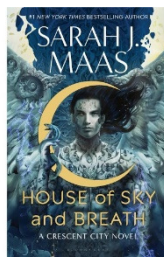
Will the steady march of dark forces destroy Hetty's universe - or can love ultimately triumph?

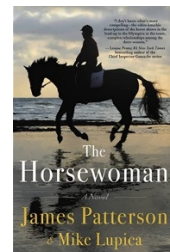
