Love and Ruin: A Novel / by Paula McLain / published 2018 / 388 pages



Historical fiction telling the story of Martha Gellhorn and Ernest Hemingway's relationship prior to and during their short marriage. Both ambitious writers butting heads over and over. Martha trying to be known independently from her famous husband. Covers World War II at times so history buffs will enjoy. Dragged on a bit too long for my liking, but well written.

Then She Was Gone: A Novel / by Lisa Jewel / published 2018 / 388 pages



The 15-year-old daughter disappears leaving a family in tatters. Told from several points of view, the story is about loss, love, recovery from the unthinkable. Rather unbelievable at times, but story keeps your attention. Fairly satisfying ending for most characters. Lots of twists and turns but easy to read. Good development of characters.
