Summer Reading and Children's Programs

The theme of the 2019 Summer Reading and Children's Programs is "A Universe of Stories." Once again, Kraemer Library joined with the Spring Green and Lone Rock libraries to provide separate programs and events for all ages on one convenient calendar. Registration begins on June 7 and is a three-step process. (1) Sign up at one, two, or all three libraries and collect your reading log. (2) Read and attend library programs and any of the libraries and have your attendance marked in the log. Keep in mind that registered children must read 3.5 hours per week for entry into grand prizes and will get an additional entry, each week, for double reading and/ or attending one program a week. (3) Submit your finished logs by the end of the program on August 10th to be eligible for grand prizes. June activities for Kraemer Library are summarized below.

Children – Storytime on Tuesdays June 11 (robots), 18 (shooting stars), 25 (blast off!), July 2 (I'm An Astronaut), and July 9 (Aliens). Storytime begins at 10:15 am and is designed for children from birth to age 5, but all ages are welcome.




Teens – Teen Tuesdays: June 11-Post-It Wars and July 2 – Light Up Canvas at 6 pm.

- Tuesday, July 9, 2 pm **Indoor Star Party**. Explore our indoor planetarium and star stations.


Friends of the Library News

The reviews will be posted near the New Arrivals. Here is a review of a novel in the historical fiction genre submitted by a patron.

The Lost Family // Jenna Blum // 2018 // 417 pages

The sad story of a survivor of Auschwitz, comes to America to start over but can never reconcile the loss of his wife and twin daughters. His guilt prevents him from ever truly starting over, although he remarries and has a child. The book covers the period 1965 to 1986 in the life of Peter Rashkin. The ending is not terribly satisfying, but not unexpected – no happily-ever-after. Well written book with believable characters.
