
Construction

Hours – Monday-Thursday 10 am-6 pm / Friday 10 am-5 pm / Saturday 10 am-2 pm.







The Girls Who Stepped Out of Line: Untold Stories of the Women Who Changed the Course of World War II / Major General Mari K. Eder / 307 pages

This book is an additional reference for readers who enjoy historical novels. The author tells the story of "women who fought for their lives, for their loved ones, and for what was *right* during WW II." The women profiled in the book were spies for the OSS, nurses, pilots, code breakers, map makers, or prisoners in the camps. The last two chapters focus on activities of the women after the war and a look ahead to current women who were inspired by these ladies to do the right thing.


